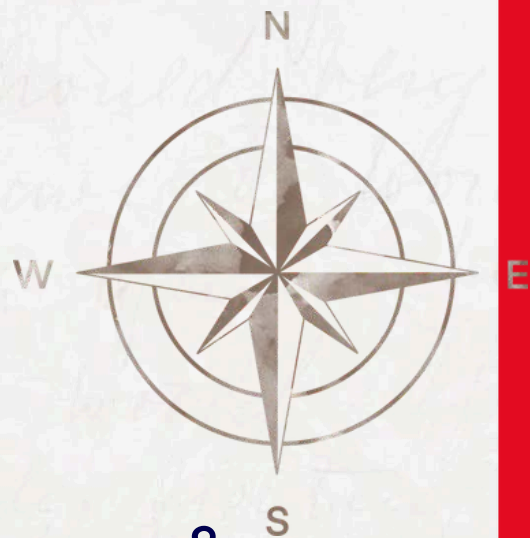
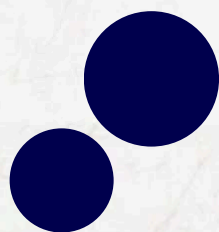

U.S. Coast Guard Aux Vessel Examinations At The TYC Saturday June 8, 2024 from 10:00 to 14:00 - Mark Your Calendars

On Saturday June 8, 2024 from 10:00 (10am) to 14:00(2pm) at the Taunton Yacht Club, the U. S. Coast Guard Auxiliary Flotilla 6-3 out of Onset-Wareham-Marion under the command of Officer Catherine Backstrom will be performing Vessel Examinations.

There are different safety requirements based on your size boat. U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary Check List pamphlets will be available at the TYC for review or you can go online. The pamphlets list the proper safety gear for different size boats. All safety gear listed must be in working condition and within expiration dates including, air horns, fire extinguishers, running lights, flares, and registration documents. Of note all boats must have PFD's (Personal Flotation Devices) in good condition on board for each person, including the required throwable PFD class IV.

But there are other helpful tips of note not on the checklist as follows:

If you have Inflatable PFD's they must have a full CO2 Cartridges and current expiration "Bobbin Dates". Bobbins expire in three years on average.

Make sure you check in advance the Pyrotechnic Flare expiration dates (42 months from mfg. date) so you have time to purchase new ones if necessary. Note: last year stores were out of stock on this type of flare. Some members upgraded to the new "electronic flares" that do not expire. Make sure you know how to use and activate them. You will be asked to demonstrate the "electronic flares" by the examiner.

A boat will fail the inspection even if the Fire Extinguisher gauges are in the green. The fire extinguishers are considered expired if not within twelve years after the date stamped on the bottom, regardless of what the gauge says. All extinguishers must say U.S.C.G Approved.

The Captain must have the Original Registration or Documentation papers on the boat. A picture of your Registration or Documentation on your phone or a photo copy DOES NOT replace the actual documents that need to be kept on the vessel.

All vessels that pass the vessel examination will receive a written report and a 2024 U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary sticker to be placed on the vessels port windshield.

From the Fleet Captain:

Please consider joining the Taunton Yacht Club on our cruise to Mystic Seaport in July. We are planning on departing TYC in the early afternoon of Friday July 5, and staying overnight at the club mooring at Dutch Harbor in Jamestown. Club members should raft up and consider joining a pot luck supper, with appropriate libations to salute the sunset.

Saturday I plan on getting underway at first light in order to get through Block Island Sound and the section of Long Island Sound early – hopefully a calm passage. The earlier in the day the less lumpy the seas will be. Tie up at assigned berths at Mystic Seaport Museum Marina.

The marina asks that we not arrive until 12:40, but given the transit time we should be fine.

The transit from Fisher's Island Sound to the museum is a little complex, but should be easy for anyone with their eyes open. It's several miles, twists and turns and is narrow in spots, but it's well marked. Captains – update your charts! There are two draw bridges – the first one you encounter is the railroad bridge which will open whenever you want as long as the train schedule permits. The second is the highway bridge which opens at 40 minutes after the hour, every hour. Both bridges guard VHF Channel 13 – contact them for openings. The transit is almost entirely no-wake speed.

Mystic is a fascinating and beautiful town. Tons of shops and multiple really good restaurants – the main problem is maintaining the waistline. Your slip fee includes admission to the museum. Google themuseum for details.

Make your reservations on Dockwa for Mystic Seaport Museum Marina. I suggest making the reservations now, as you can cancel up to a week or so before at no charge, but if you wait you might find it filled up. When you make your reservations, make a notation “Taunton Yacht Club” cruise so they know to berth us together.

Display your TYC burgee at the forepeak!

I plan on departing on Monday July 8. Those who have to be at work on Monday will leave on Sunday. After leaving, I'm going to Essex for two days, then across Long Island Sound to Port Jefferson for two days then back home on either Friday or Saturday July 12 or 13.
